Monday	<p>Listen to <i>The Quilt Story</i> with your child listed in the link below. Ask questions from the Parent Note cards (see email attachment).</p> <p>Name 3 words that rhyme with "hop" Can you think of more?</p>	<p>I Spy Sounds Game- Play a game of "I Spy" looking for things at home that make the /h/ sound. Allow your child to "hunt" for items that begin with that sound.</p> <p>Log in to Imagine Learning to get individualized practice.</p>	<p>Number Hunt: Hide numbers written on sheets of paper around the house for your child to find from 0-10. As they find them, have them identify the number on each piece of paper.</p> <p>Log into Imagine Math and work on a lesson.</p>	<p>Science Activity- Discuss seasonal changes and how we will dress in the Spring and Summer months. How is what we wear different in the Winter and Fall?</p>	<p>Daniel Tiger's Life Little Lessons: Talk with your child about perseverance with Daniel Tiger using the video clips at https://pbskids.org/learn/lifes-little-lessons/persistence/</p>
Tuesday	<p>Listen to <i>Spike in the City</i> with your child listed in the link below. Ask question from the Parent Note cards (see email attachment).</p> <p>Happy Cinco De Mayo! Pick a fun game or craft to celebrate. Teachers are sharing fun resources online.</p>	<p>Write the letter H in the air. Practice writing uppercase and lowercase H. Name three words that begin with the letter H. Draw 1 thing that start with the letter H sound.</p> <p>Log in to Imagine Learning to get individualized practice.</p>	<p>Addition Practice- Using dried small items that can be counted, create simple addition problems for your child to solve. 5 pennies plus 2 pennies equal 7 pennies.</p>	<p>Social Studies Activity- Discuss the difference between "wants" and "needs" with your child. Make a list with your child of "wants" (things that they want to have for fun), and "needs" (things that one needs to live).</p>	<p>Daniel Tiger's Life Little Lessons: Talk with your child about the Daniel Tiger videos you watched yesterday. Help your child set a goal for themselves to accomplish (ex. Tying shoes, riding a bike, etc.). Support them to persevere by finding time to practice reaching that goal.</p>
Wednesday	<p>Listen to <i>Isla</i> with your child listed in the link below. Ask questions from the Parent Note cards (see email attachment).</p> <p>Name 3 words that rhyme with "cat." Can you think of more?</p>	<p>Trace the letter V in the air. Practice writing the letter V. Name 3 things that start with Vv and the "V" sound. If you have playdough, make a letter Vv.</p> <p>Log in to Imagine Learning to get individualized practice.</p>	<p>Who's in Line? Using small items such as cars, blocks, or pennies, line up no more than five items. Ask your children using ordinal numbers (first, second, third, etc.) ask your child to identify in random order each items place in the line as you call them out to them.</p> <p>Log into Imagine Math and work on a lesson.</p>	<p>Science Activity: Go outside early in the morning to find the sun. Discuss whether it is cold/warm out and where the sun is located. Go out again at midday to find the sun. Discuss the difference in the sun's position and the temperature outside from the morning to midday.</p>	<p>Daniel Tiger's Life Little Lessons: Discuss friendship with your child with the Daniel Tiger video clips and resources at https://pbskids.org/learn/lifes-little-lessons/friendship/</p>
Thursday	<p>Listen to <i>Grumpy Monkey</i> listed on the link below. Discuss the word "grumpy" and what it means. Can you remember a time when you felt like Jim? What made you feel that way? What made you feel better? Is it okay to feel grumpy? (of course it is)</p>	<p>Draw "Grumpy Monkey". Why is your monkey grumpy? As your child explains why the monkey is grumpy, write their explanation down underneath their drawing.</p> <p>Draw a heart. Heart begins with the /h/ sound. What other words do you know that begin with /h/. As your child names the words, write each word on paper for them to see.</p>	<p>Solid vs. Flat Shapes- Select a few items around the house such as a sheet of paper, a can, a tissue box, a penny, a wall clock, a picture in a frame, etc. Ask your child to identify if it is a solid shape or a flat shape?</p> <p>Log into Imagine Math and work on a lesson.</p>	<p>Social Studies Activity- Discuss with your child how families work together to help each other. Work with your child to develop ways in which they can help at home (wiping the table, polishing furniture, dusting, etc.) Give them a task to help at home.</p>	<p>Daniel Tiger's Life Little Lessons: Talk to your child about friendship. Develop some strategies for making new friends in kindergarten.</p>
Friday	<p>Listen to one of this week's books again- ask the follow up questions on parent notes. Choose some vocabulary to talk about. Read a book from home. Ask your child who are the characters in the story? Each choose a favorite page to talk about together.</p>	<p>Review the letter V. What sound does V make? What words can you name that begin with /V/? Sing and dance to the Letter V Song listed in the link below.</p> <p>Log in to Imagine Learning to get individualized practice.</p>	<p>Measurement Activity: Using a small matchbox car, paper clip, or piece of string, measure familiar items around the house such as dolls or action figures. How many units long were the items you measured? <i>Example: The Barbie doll was 7 paperclips long</i> Log into Imagine Math and work on a lesson.</p>	<p>Science Activity: Go on a nature walk looking for bugs. Use your senses to look, listen and smell for bugs. Try to mimic the bugs movements. Use the Animals/Bugs resource to guide you through the activity.</p>	<p>Parent Reflection: What went well this week and what do we need to adjust? Ask your child what they liked best this week.</p> <p>Happy Mother's Day! Pick a Mother's Day craft for your child to make. Teachers are sharing resources online.</p>
